

Some Tips...


- To make the full use of it, you can enjoy "Advanced search".
- With which, you can search by languages, by the holding library etc...
- You can search more efficiently with...
- "#" (sharp) search: Put "#" before the search word.
- The result page will show you the book (journal) which have the exactly same title or author's name.
- " * " (asterisk) search : Put "*" after the search word.
- e.g.) If you search "japan*", the result page will show books including the term "japan" or "japanese".

If you find e-books (-journals), you can directly access to the text on web.

(To read it, however, you need to have already installed the designated

plug-in on your computer.)



...includes articles of natural science, cultural or social science, written in English. Every article reviewed.


CiNii Articles


...includes articles of any speciality (academic journals, bulletins), written in Japanese.

use Web of Science












Discovery (by K.U.)

...is a unifying search tool which includes data from Kuline and individual database sites (Web of science, CiNii, ...).



When using Discovery, you need to know that...

- it sometimes lacks the newest articles which the original database sites have.
- •it will show you vast amount of data.


 sometimes it is difficult to access to the article which you really want.

4. If you cannot find them in K.U. ...

Options...

- 1 Request loan, request copy. (from other universities' libraries)
- ②Ask a K.U. library to buy the book.
 - 3 Visit other universities' libraries.
 - 4 Buy it by yourself. (Sometimes this is the easiest way...)
