Peter Vodosek is Professor Emeritus of Library Science, Hochschule der Medien/University of Applied Sciences, Stuttgart (Germany). He has published many works on German library history. He is a member of Wolfenbuetteler Arbeitskreis für Bibliotheks-, Buch- und ediengeschichte, Historische Kommission des Boersenvereins des deutschen Buchhandels, *Deutsche Buchwissenschaftliche Gesellschaft*, Dansk Bibliotekshistorisk Selskab, and also a member of the Editorial Boards of *Library History* and *Bibliothek. Forschung & Praxis*.

Marian Koren is Head of Research and International Affairs at the Netherlands Public Library Association. Her Ph. D. study: *Tell me! The Right of the Child to Information* (1996, University of Amsterdam) reflects her interests and studies in international law, Scandinavian languages and human development, and her experiences in library policy innovation. She is member of the Editorial Board for the *Journal of Documentation*, and member of the IFLA Governing Board.
